In the 70's, I was Yvette Roland and I was in the teen club at the Oakland Community School. The panthers same our live. We had photography class, sex education class at Children's Hospital. We had karate classes at the school. We loved two skate and when we had no monies to go I remember, Elaine Brown saying pass me my purse and give us the monies. We were teens, putting flyers on doors in West Oakland, to elect the first black mayor Lionel Wilson. Knocking on doors on election day to make sure the people voted. We made a difference. We had talent shows, talent-thon and Don Cornelius donate \$1000.00. We had a dance, and troublemakers showed up and one the brothers was fatally killed and I remember at his service his favorite song was TOBACCO ROW. The BPP made a difference in a lot of our lives. Me and a lot the teens who were party of the teen club still get together. I am 47 years old now and live in Fairfield
