Carol Williams is an award winning journalist and author whose work is featured in numerous publications including "Celling America's Soul" a montage of stories written by prisoners and their supporters. The book creates a virtual visit behind the walls of the nation's prison system.

In 2001 Williams was elected by the **Metro News** as one of ten Black women in Philadelphia to admire. Others on the list included, Pearl Bailey, Patti LaBelle and Roxanne Jones

Ms. Williams appeared on the 48 UPDATE television show as a result of an article that she wrote concerning HIV teens. She is the founder of the **People's Coalition For Justice and Humanity** (<a href="www.justiceandhumanity.com">www.justiceandhumanity.com</a>) a grassroots effort to spread information about the worldwide human condition and help people to reconnect with their humanity. Williams is a Temple University graduate with a Bachelor's Degree in human welfare.

The move to radio came when Ms. Williams realized that there had to be a platform for youth to speak out and for the community to discuss, explore and discover solutions to problems facing them. Thus, this former Evangelist and member of the original Black Panther Party created Grounds, the original Youth Empowerment Show. The show not only is a platform for youth it also offers the opportunity to confront issues concerning the general state of our community.

Former guests include, Ramona Africa, the Tuskegee Airmen, The Philadelphia Prison Experimentation Survivors, Philabundance and many others.

Grounds 4 Discussion is a link and a platform for public discussion and education and can be heard on the afroradionetwork.com, an internet radio station for the African American Community on Saturday's 6-7 p.m. and on WPEB FM 88.1 (<a href="www.wpebfm.org">www.wpebfm.org</a>) on Sundays from 2-4 p.m. Williams is currently working to bring this innovative communications tool to public radio.
